

B.A. in International Studies

Students will take 24 semester hours within the major, choosing five courses from the Topical Emphases, two courses from the Area Emphases, and one course in Theory.

First: Starting with the Topical Emphases from List A below, they will select course work from **one of the three** central themes:

- 1) Modernization, Development, and Environment, 2) War and Peace Studies, or 3) Society, Cultures, and Tradition.

Second: They must include courses from **at least two** of the World Areas from List B: Asia, Africa, Latin America, and Europe.

Third: They will include **one** course in the theory of the field (List C), chosen in consultation with the advisor.
